Publishing their findings is essential for researchers regarding their career, recognition, and contribution to the community, yet to many the process of publication remains a black box: many manuscripts go in, but only few comes out, and few knows why. This thus presents an obstacle for sharing one's hard works by publicizing them on a journal with matching scope, reputation and readership. In this presentation, I wish to first introduce to you our journals, Nature Communications and Nature Immunology, about their scope, goal and general metrics. I will then share with you information about our editorial processing, such as editorial criteria, referee selection, decision consideration, and post-decision actions. Lastly, I will provide concise, high-level suggestions on manuscript composition and presentation. I am hoping that this information may enhance your chance of publishing on a suitable scientific journal.
